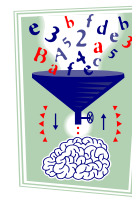




# Faith & Facts: The Budget

Woe to those who make unjust laws, to those who issue oppressive decrees, to deprive the poor of their rights and withhold justice from the oppressed of my people. *(Isaiah 10:1-2)*

But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you... and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will have your welfare. *(Jeremiah 29:7)*

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. *(Matthew 6:21)*

We hold governments responsible for the ... guarantee of the rights to adequate food, clothing, shelter, education, and health care. *(Social Principles ¶164.a)*

We recognize the responsibility of governments to develop and implement sound fiscal and monetary policies that provide for the economic life of individuals and corporate entities and that ensure full employment and adequate incomes with a minimum of inflation. *(Social Principles ¶163)*

We support measures that would reduce the concentration of wealth in the hands of a few. *(Social Principles ¶163)*

Whereas, tax laws are necessary to raise revenues to meet the minimum health, safety, educational, and welfare needs of the community, the Judeo-Christian standards of justice require that the taxes imposed be fair to poor and low-income citizens and raise adequate revenues for the society's common good *(2004 Book of Resolutions #228 Establish Annual Conference State Taxation Task Force)*

The government is confiscating the financial security of the vulnerable poor and elderly in order to fund the military costs of foreign conflicts. *(2004 Book of Resolutions #232 - Negative Implications of US Deficit Spending)*

Federal Budget Deficit in the US: FY2006 = \$248 billion<sup>1</sup> (Federal Debt = \$8.4 trillion<sup>1</sup>)  
Federal Budget Deficit without Social Security "surplus": FY2005 = \$508 billion<sup>1</sup>  
Other "Deficits" in the US: 45.8 million people lack health insurance<sup>2</sup>, 12.7% of the total population lives in poverty (37 million people) and 10.8 million suffer from hunger<sup>3</sup>

% of federal budget spent on education and training programs: 2.5  
% of federal budget spent on the military: 20

Change in average after-tax income over the last 15 years (by income group)<sup>4</sup>:  
Lowest fifth: \$600      Highest fifth: \$48,800      Top 1%: \$395,700

Average value of recent tax cuts (by income group)<sup>4</sup>:  
Lowest fifth: \$18      Highest fifth: \$4,845      Top 1%: \$34,948

Proposed change to military spending in FY07 budget: \$79 billion **increase**.  
Proposed change to food nutrition programs: \$656 million **cut**.
