Have You Heard of Genocide?

Genocide is mass murder – killing people because of their nationality, race or religion. The dictionary defines genocide as the deliberate and systematic destruction of a racial, political, or cultural group.

Did You Know?

- Over 500,000 people have been murdered in the Darfur region of the Sudan.
- 2.5 million people have been displaced.
- Women and girls have been raped.
- The government of Sudan is preventing humanitarian relief from reaching those fleeing persecution.

While recognizing valid differences in culture and political philosophy, we stand for justice and peace in every nation. (United Methodist Social Principles)

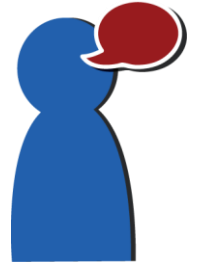


What You Can Do To Make a Difference...
